People could look at your style and fun nature and assume you were immature- but you were by far one of the most deeply understanding and responsible people I know. 
Also, I know wherever you are, you are blowing up the balloons, getting party hats and playing your music. You learned how to have fun and a made a lot of other people's lives better because of that.
