Our precious Donna Marie Frisella, 73, was taken home to be with the Lord at 6:32 pm., Monday, November 11, 2019. Her death was caused by a massive heart attack.

Donna was born on April 20, 1946 to Donald and Janet Roche, of Emington, Illinois on Donald's

25th birthday. She was the oldest of four girls and a beloved sister. She attended Saunemin High School and graduated in 1964. Donna was crowned homecoming queen, won the area
