The family faithfully attended St. Stephen Lutheran Church until its closure and then Ann joined St. Paul A.M.E. Ann worked at St. Patrick's Parish, Mother Good Counsel Parish, and volunteered at St. Louis Public School. Ann and Arthur owned several businesses such as; Nelson Maintenance & Janitorial Services, and A&A Resale Shop. Ann enjoyed being a wife for seventy-four years, cooking, spending time with her family, grand and great grandchildren, and friends. Ann welcomed everyone to her table for a meal and words of wisdom. On Tuesday, September 15, 2020, at 5:30 a.m. Our Father in Heaven transitioned Ann from this to her new home with the Lord. She joins her husband, Arthur Nelson, Sr., her parents, and five children; Robert, Berta, Charles, Brenda, and Larry.
