



Nancy Graves Perrin

May 11, 1935 - May 4, 2022

Nancy Warwick Graves Perrin, 86, of Creve Coeur, passed away on May 4, 2022, in Creve Coeur, Missouri.

Nancy was born in Atlanta, Georgia, to Nancy Warwick Graves and Howard Cleaton Graves on May 11, 1935. She attended Birmingham-Southern College in Alabama. Nancy married Victor Don Perrin on June 9, 1956, at Haygood Memorial United Methodist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. Nancy passed away one week before her 87th birthday and five weeks before their 66th wedding anniversary. Nancy worked at Coca Cola's International Headquarters in Atlanta for three years as Secretary to the Vice President of Marketing, and for 20 years as Production Assistant for Lincoln National Life Insurance Company in St. Louis, Missouri. Nancy was an accomplished ballroom and swing dancer. She taught private dance lessons as well as group ballroom and swing dancing for St. Louis Community College and the YMCA. Nancy taught dancing from 1985 until January 2022. She was also a gifted pianist and soloist at churches in Alabama, Georgia, California, North Carolina, and Missouri.

Nancy is preceded in death by her parents.

Loving and devoted wife and mother, Nancy is survived by husband Don and their four children, son, Vic Perrin (Amie), daughter, Donna Sarmanian (David), daughter, Sandra Merritt (Dallas), and daughter, Jill Perrin; sisters

Patricia Kees and Susan Melton (Jim); and 'Nina' to 11 grandchildren Jeff (Stephanie), Cortni, Katy, Sarah (AJ), David (Aisha), Kylie, Michael, Joey (Samantha), Nicholas, Sammy, and Claire; and seven great-grandchildren Austin, Owen, Isa, Abby, Flora, Hannah, and Cameron.

“ After starting Variety Dance at the Edward Jones YMCA, I didn't know Nancy Perrin. There were other dancers who joined me in practice times in order to actually start a class named Variety Dance (now known as Dance Fitness). YMCA management liked the idea and I wanted it well known that we were not a line dance class, but would include some line dancing in our class. I met Nancy in a Cardio Mix class (called Silver Sneakers) taught by my good friend Jeff Mahoney. When I found out about Nancy Perrin's ballroom instructor past, I recruited her to be our ballroom instructor for Variety Dance. She accepted the challenge and became everyone's darling teacher with her strict rules about "frame" and "footwork". I thought of myself as a pretty good dancer, but Nancy showed me I had a lot to learn as a ballroom co-instructor or demonstrator. The times were so fun with her and I asked her if she would perform a waltz and swing dance with me at one of our potluck YMCA luncheons. She again accepted the challenge. Because of her COPD, I broke the performance into two separate sequences so she could catch her breath. At the end of the waltz, I apologized that we did not do the promenade sequence with a chassis and she told me nobody noticed. I looked at her and told her how very special she is. I didn't worry about the swing dance as it was not choreographed and we just danced very well, with enthusiasm and smile on our faces. I had a photo of us with Linda Kramer in between two of my Friday classes with a pair of pants that my sister Cheryl had given me. The pants were white with big black notes, just like piano score sheet music. If I knew how to post it I would. Perhaps I can do an update later! Thanks so much for all the wonderful times you gave me Nancy. I will always think of you, when I ballroom dance! Love you Nancy P!
