June 5, 1948 - August 4, 2015

Randall was born in St Louis to Harold and Alma [nee Raby] Hassell.

Randy was an internationally recognized authority on the history of traditional Shotokan karate and the published author of 28 books. He taught karate to thousands of students in the St. Louis area for more than 45 years through his own club, school districts, and YMCAs.

He also served in the United States Air Force.

He is survived by his wife of 29 years, Marilyn [nee Camden];

I am not sure if you remember me, but I was in your classes that Sensei and Sensei taught at my school, Block Yeshiva in Olivette, throughout my years of middle school and high school.

I can not thank you enough for all of the time, effort, and energy that both of you put into teaching us. As with some things in life, you sometimes only fully realize what you have when you no longer have access to them. I wish I could go back and take your classes over again. I know that I loved coming to your classes, and really and truly learned a fortune, a lot of which I still remember today-- not only for physical well being, but the life lessons you taught us as well -- such as, I still remember how Sensei told us that in Japan the price for a small coke was the same as for a big coke as people there will buy what they need and not more; they do not waste. I am so so sorry for your loss. Sensei was truly a great man; a person whom I will continue to have the utmost respect for as I strive to live my life by the lessons he and his wife imparted to me. I know I will carry your lessons with me as I attempt to follow in your footsteps, as you are the role models I have modeled myself on in order to shape the person I am today, (which is still a work in progress).

I wish you all much comfort during this time; and know, that Sensei lived a full life—a life, where he impacted many many people— changing the world in all he did. If only more people were like him, the world we live in today would be a completely different place. I am so privileged to have had the opportunity to learn under him and his wife and I know that I will hold those classes dear to me for many many years to come. I cannot thank you enough for giving me
